



There are two kinds of shows and events at the Gathering: ticketed and non-ticketed.

TICKETED SHOWS

Ticketed performances showcase special themes and combinations of Western musicians and cowboy poets. These shows require purchase of individual tickets and are listed in the schedule grid, designated with a ticket price and color-coded in gold.

DAYTIME NON-TICKETED SHOWS AND EVENTS

Non-ticketed shows and events take place during the day Thursday through Saturday, January 30–February 1, only. These require the purchase of a **3-Day Deluxe Pass** (\$80) or a **Single Day Pass** (\$30). There are over 100 non-ticketed shows and events during the three main days of the Gathering. They are blue in the schedule grid.

TICKET PURCHASE OPTIONS

All passes and tickets can be purchased at the ticket office in the lobby of the Elko Convention Center. Passes may also be purchased in the Gift Shop at the Western Folklife Center. Tickets can be purchased online at *nationalcowboypoetrygathering.org* up to




